NEWSLETTER GOING ONLINE

Change is coming but it will be a good change for the environment and it will allow us to devote even more funds to our education and conservation projects!

After careful consideration, the Executive Board of Evansville Audubon has made the decision to cease distributing the newsletter by mail; but instead, will make it available online. This decision was made for a variety of reasons—one of the two volunteers handling the big job of prep and mailing of paper copies of our newsletters is retiring; the bulk mail permit and mailing costs are increasing year over year; and our printing costs dictates a reduced content newsletter with limited information.

The good news is that this change will:

- Benefit the environment—no cutting down trees to provide the raw material and no paper waste to dispose of afterwards.
- Reduce costs to EAS—This past year \$835 was spent printing and mailing the newsletter.
- Allow more pages and color photos—no cost restrictions to an online newsletter.
- Increase our ability to fund even more education and conservation projects!

When will this happen? The changeover to online newsletters will happen with the Jan/Feb 2024 issue. There will be one more mailed copy—the Nov/Dec issue—to give everyone time to send us their email address so that we can send email notifications with the attached newsletter.

PROGRAMS

Programs are on the third Tuesday of every other month at Wesselman Woods Nature Center at 6 PM (central time) and are free and open to the public. Any last minute changes will be posted on our Facebook page, Website, and via email.

Sept 19, 2023 - "Curiosities Discovered Along the Bluebird Trail", presented by Bob and Judy Peak. The Peaks will discuss some of the unusual things they have encountered during their 34 years of monitoring and managing bluebird boxes.

Nov. 21, 2023 - "Dancing with Grouse in the Sandhills" presented by Richard and Sue Vernier, long-time Evansville Audubon members and photographers. The Verniers will share their experience viewing Prairie Chickens and Sharp-tailed Grouse in Nebraska. A bonus feature will include Sandhill Cranes along the Platte River.

Jan. 16, 2024 - "Cranes Over Indiana" presented by the International Crane Foundation. The program will focus on both the Sandhill and Whooping Cranes, their history, and current conservation.

EVANSVILLE AUDUBON SOCIETY EDUCATION & CONSERVATION GRANTS ARE AVAILABLE

Evansville Audubon Society is now accepting applications for their education and conservation grants! We are offering small grants (generally \$300 to \$750) for individual or group projects that are either educational in nature or support a conservation need and include an emphasis on the environment.

Applications should include:

- A brief description of the project
- * Items/activities to be accomplished by the project
- * Budget amount to meet the goal
- * Timeline for completion of the project

If you have an education or conservation project in mind for which a small grant would be beneficial; or you know of an organization or individual in need of a grant, simply email the information to info@evvaudubon.org. All grant requests are considered on a first-come, first-serve basis until all funds available are expended.

Projects that we've funded in the past include: Talon Trust; Tekoppel 2nd grade classroom bird watching project; "Sponsor a Preserve" project at Eagle Slough; Wesselman Woods summer camp scholarships; Friends of Patoka River NWR pollinator gardens; Howell Wetlands prairie restoration; and education outreach to schools, scouts, community groups, and more.

<u>New Business</u> A meeting is scheduled on May 19 on Lewis Memorial Grant with Zack Garcia (Nature Center), Will Schaust (Wild Birds Unlimited) and Brian Taylor (EAS). The Lewis family has proposed underwriting a series of family birding educational programs with a number of specific suggestions for topics and schedule. Of the \$4510 in the donation \$4010 would go for these programs, \$500 to Eagle Slough.

<u>Items from the floor</u> Jared Emmack from Hovey Lake presented a plan for a new 2 mile loop trail in a 140 acre Rail Marsh area south of the main lake. Funding is needed for lumber for a viewing platform (\$900) and signage (\$300). EAS tentatively approved donating the remaining \$500 in the Education and Conservation Fund.
