NEWSLETTER GOING ONLINE

After careful consideration, the Executive Board of Evansville Audubon has made the decision to cease distributing the newsletter by mail; but instead, will make it available online. This decision was made for a variety of reasons—one of the two volunteers handling the big job of prep and mailing of paper copies of our newsletters is retiring; the bulk mail permit and mailing costs are increasing year over year; and our printing costs dictates a reduced content newsletter with limited information.

The good news is that this change will:

- Benefit the environment—no cutting down trees to provide the raw material and no paper waste to dispose of afterwards.
- Reduce costs to EAS—This past year \$835 was spent printing and mailing the newsletter.
- Allow more pages and color photos—no cost restrictions to an online newsletter.
- Increase our ability to fund even more education and conservation projects!

When will this happen? The changeover to online newsletters will happen with the Jan/Feb 2024 issue. This November/December issue will be the last paper copy to be mailed. Don't forget to send us your email address so that we can send email notifications with the attached newsletter beginning in January.

PROGRAMS

March 19, 2024 -- "Natives and You" presented by Donnarae of Ancient Roots Native Nursery. A program on planting native.

AUDUBON'S 124TH CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT

Each winter, thousands of volunteers across the country pack up their binoculars and bird guides and head out on a mission. They are joining the National Audubon Society's annual Christmas Bird Count!

The Evansville Audubon Society invites birdwatchers to participate in the longest-running community science survey. Birders of all ages and skill levels are welcome to contribute to this nationwide community science project which provides a crucial snapshot of our native bird populations during the winter months. - . Indiana Audubon 'Chasing Melody' Sponsorship to monitor & stop decline of Wood Thrush in Indiana


